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One

God supplies seed to the sower.

2-Corinthians-9:10-Amplified-Bible

And [God] Who provides seed for the sower and bread for eating will also provide and multiply your [resources for] sowing and increase the fruits of your righteousness [which manifests itself in active goodness, kindness, and charity].

In this scripture there is a promise from God, it is for those who sow generously they will reap back a harvest in God's good time an abundance of blessings. **You will reap whatever seed you sow**, if you sow financial seeds you will reap a financial harvest; if you sow seeds of healing you will harvest a healing revival; if you sow seeds of faith you will harvest a faith filled harvest.

Sad to say most Christians think about sowing and reaping as something to do with money, but this is not so, whatever seed you sow, you will reap a harvest later on in the harvest season. If your seed is a bad seed of hatred, anger, bitterness you will reap that harvest yourself sometime in the future. A harvest does not grow overnight. A farmer plants a seed of corn, he does not look out his window next morning expecting to see a new cornfield filled with ripened corn cobs; he knows it takes it time growing daily, where others cannot see it; under the ground at first, then upright later on, and you still can't see it grow unless you use one of those special cameras they use on nature programmes, but you can't see the steady growth with your natural eyes. But it does grow into maturity a full healthy corn or wheat or whatever was sown, and it is the same in the spiritual world. We plant seed into the world of the supernatural, God's hidden world, and in there our sown seed matures until it comes time for a spiritual harvest.

We know from the word of God that the seed God desires us to sow is the seed of salvation a seed of souls. If you continue planting words about salvation and Jesus you will eventually harvest a crop of souls for God or someone else will reap that harvest you sowed. In God's kingdom one sows another waters but it is God who makes the garden grow, we don't sow seeds for our benefit, we sow seeds for the kingdom, what does it matter to us if we sow a seed and someone else comes along and waters that seed and that seed, cause the person to grow in Christ Jesus, we done our job another done theirs but it is God who is glorified by the soul harvested, there is no jealousy in the kingdom of God. God the Father is not jealous when Jesus is glorified and the Holy Spirit is not jealous when Jesus is credited with miracle working power or healing, when it was the Holy Spirits power in him that caused that miracle or healing to happen, God is glorified that's all that counts. And so there is no jealousy in our lives when we sow and someone else reaps what we sowed, our Job was to bring souls to the kingdom and glorify God, mission accomplished, Amen. God also asks us to plant seeds of love and other seed also.

John-4:37-New-International-Version

Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true.

The food of the Christian should be the sharing of the gospel with others. Doing the will of the Father; doing what Jesus did, is food, harvest food. Jesus tells us in the next scripture that the fields are ripe for harvest, and we are the harvesters as well as the seed sower, sharing equality with our brothers and sisters in the lord.

John-4:34-New-International-Version ³⁴ “My food,” said Jesus “is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. ³⁵ Don’t you have a saying, ‘It’s still four months until harvest’? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. ³⁶ Even now the one who reaps draws a wage and harvests a crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. ³⁷ Thus the saying ‘One sows and another reaps’ is true. ³⁸ I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labour.”

I have sown into a church that I go to, healing seeds, sharing healings that Jesus done through me, to glorify our God, and a young man started following me and sharing with me, now he is ministering healing; he grew in confidence and stepped out when I encouraged him and healings happened for him, now he is encouraging others to have a go, and is growing stronger in faith that I am, am I jealous? No! It is God who is glorified, my job was to encourage others to step out in faith and lay hands, I sowed a healing seed, and now healings are happening through this young man and some others who let the seed go into them also and take root; **so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together.**

I rejoice with him every time God heals someone through him and he rejoices with me when the lord heals through me, we are as this scripture says are, ‘glad together.’ Just last week he was ordained in the church, recognised as an evangelist by the church and was ordained one. I am not ordained in this church but does that bother me? No, I rejoiced with him. I know deep down it was God using me to encourage this young man by my seed sowing.

Two

Making big mistakes

As Christians we make a big mistake in our sowing and reaping; **we don’t ask the giver of seeds for the seed we need to sow**; we sow financially, hoping for a financial harvest, and that is the most common seed sowing, but has those who have sowed this seed asked the giver of the seed, **is this the seed you want me to sow?** Most Christians don’t ask the seed giver what he would like them to sow; now with God everything is free gift, God gives us everything for nothing, contrary to some teaching I have heard lately. You cannot earn anything from God it is all gift. But are we Christians asking the giver of the seed, **“is this the seed you want me to sow,”** am I sowing the wrong seed for my harvest whatever it may be? I could be sowing the wrong seed, I never asked until now as I write this teaching book. And what has put me off sowing seeds is Those TV evangelist asking people to sow into their ministry; it all seemed to be about money.

I know Christians who have sowed seeds of money hoping for a nice return, Some Christian preachers on TV tell people to sow into their ministry and receive a hundred fold in return, some are so bold as to ask for a \$5,000-00 seed, {maybe God told them to do this I don’t know but the only people that seems to reap a harvest from it are the ones asking for the five

thousand dollar seed.} I could be totally wrong of course? But this is what has put me off seed sowing until now.

2 Corinthians 9-6-New International Version

6 Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.⁷ Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion for God loves a cheerful giver
8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

9 As it is written: “They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever.”¹⁰ Now **he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness.**¹¹ **You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.**

God’s word says whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will reap generously, that is a promise from God in our seed sowing; we just seem to be asked to sow into churches or ministries and we should of course sow into where we are taught the word of God, to support those teaching and feeding us with the word, if they are truly feeding us the truth of the gospel.

Jesus said to go and preach the gospel to the entire world; well maybe your entire world is your surroundings your friends and neighbours, that is where you sow your seed of evangelism, simply put, you sow those evangelistic seeds with the people you know and with those in your area when the opportunity arises. We actually should ask the seed giver for the opportune moments to share with others about Jesus. His seed that he gives to you to sow will bear fruit if we ask him for evangelistic seed, and for the right time to sow that seed. Sometimes Christians try to share the word of God with others and without success, and they wonder why no one seems to listen to them, scripture says there is **a time to sow and a time to reap**, a time to live a time to die, there is a **time** in God’s plan for everything, and it is doing things in God’s perfect timing that makes the seed you sow go into good soil. We, until now wanted to do things our way, we tell people about Jesus and we get rebuked, not interested they say, you start up a new project and it fails even though you felt this project was from God, in fact you knew it was from God but it failed, why? Because you started it in your timing and not in God’s timing and both timings did not line up together. Read this following scripture and take in what it says, **for everything there is a season**, and that means exactly that, there is a proper time in God’s plan a season to do things as he wants. Now read on.

Ecclesiastes 3

Complete Jewish Bible (CJB)

**3 For everything there is a season,
a right time for every intention under heaven —**

**2 a time to be born and a time to die,
a time to plant and a time to uproot,**

**³ a time to kill and a time to heal,
a time to tear down and a time to build,
⁴ a time to weep and a time to laugh,
a time to mourn and a time to dance,
⁵ a time to throw stones and a time to gather stones,
a time to embrace and a time to refrain,
⁶ a time to search and a time to give up,
a time to keep and a time to discard,
⁷ a time to tear and a time to sew,
a time to keep silent and a time to speak,
⁸ a time to love and a time to hate,
a time for war and a time for peace.**

⁹ What does the worker gain from his efforts? ¹⁰ I have seen the task God has given humanity to keep us occupied.¹¹ He has made everything suited to its time; also, he has given human beings an awareness of eternity; but in such a way that they can't fully comprehend, from beginning to end, the things God does.

The seed giver knows the precise time to plant seeds for different crops; you don't plant potatoes at the same time that you plant corn. Or you don't plant tulips at the same time you plant summer plants, tulips bulbs are planted in winter and they show up in the spring. Marigold is planted in spring and show up in early summer. If you planted tulips in summer you will not get a harvest and the same with marigolds. God knows the right time to give you the seeds you ask for, and if you asked him what seeds does he want you to plant he will tell you and will also supply the necessary seed to sow, and will tell you the precise time to sow, and then later on someone else or maybe you will reap a harvest of souls, healing, miracles. We don't see miracles enough these days, because Christians are not asking for the miracle seeds to sow and are not asking is this the seed you want me sowing now, or is there a different seed I need to sow first like the seed of forgiveness perhaps?

For example when praying with people for healing I usually begin by talking about forgiveness and the need for forgiveness, and also the need for **repentance for any involvement in the occult**, like reading their **stars** or **fortune telling**, or reading angel cards or tarot cards and things of the occult, and I tell them God strictly forbids this and will turn his face away from anyone who does these things. –**Leviticus-20-6**. I am **sowing seeds, of repentance** first, then when the person realises this is an abomination to God, they quickly repent for the majority of them. And then I speak of healing and sometimes share with them healing I have witnessed my lord do through me, all this time I am **seed sowing healing seed**, but never realised what I was doing until I wrote these things here in this book, I am learning also as I write, because the Holy Spirit is revealing these things to me now, and boy am I grateful to him!

Seed sowing is talking about the things concerning God and his ways. It is asking for the right time to do things instead of just doing the things you want to do. My heart's desire is to do exactly what God desires me to do and not to do my own thing. And my heart's desire is to be out there praying with people, watching God touch them and heal them and have them feel God's power on their bodies and them knowing it is not me but God himself who is touching

them, but God is wanting me to write mainly on scripture at this moment in time and that is what I am mostly doing, although there are times I have met people in pain and prayed with them there and then in the shops or street and God healed them, and yesterday I prayed with four people and God healed them and let them feel his hands on them and his presence on them, but today I am back writing this book to help you know to **ask for the right seed to sow and when to sow it**, and I also am learning as I said previously new things for myself.

With God there is always perfect timing, maybe that just wasn't the right moment that woman you prayed with to be healed, wasn't, maybe you should have asked what seed do you want me to plant first? Forgiveness seed or miracle seed then let it germinate whilst you are talking about these things and then the person is ready to receive their healing. Try asking before you go to do something for God, ask for the right seed to sow the one he knows is appropriate.

Three

Sadly many sow seeds of hatred,

Sadly as I said previously, many people sow seeds of hatred and bitterness and anger, jealousy and rage and all they will get in return for all this is a harvest of hatred, anger, bitterness, jealousy and anger come back on them, they sow these seeds out of their mouths continually. But I am not going to focus on those who live this way. I want the children of our mighty Father God to know that it is he who will supply you with seeds of love for you to sow, and seeds of faithfulness, and generosity all provided for by the seed giver.

If we could only realise the gifts that God wants to give us to sow, the gifts are also seeds, if you keep on telling people about the healing nature of Jesus and keep on watering those seeds you sow, {continually sharing with those same people} you will eventually begin reaping a harvest of hungry souls for the lord; first they will be hungry for healing, then when they have been touched by God personally in their healing of their bodies they get hungry for God himself. As I prayed with those four people a few days ago and God healed them, they wouldn't go home, they wanted to talk about God and the things of God, three hours later they finally left, and one of them expressed surprise that the young man was even interested in God, but when you meet God personally you want to be there where he is. I know that the lord had me sow the seed of God's love and healing seed, for a future growth for them and they will share with others what happened to them and those seeds will bear fruit later on.

Matthew-7:7 - King-James-Version

Ask and it shall be given you-see, and ye shall find; knock and it shall be opened unto you:

If you ask for seed from God to sow, it shall be given on to you, but before you ask, **ask first** what seed should I be sowing, then ask for the seed.

I get a lot of young women asking me to pray for a husband for them, and I sowed the word of God where scripture said 'it is not good for you to be alone.'

Matthew 19-4-Contemporary English Version (CEV)

Jesus answered, "Don't you know that in the beginning the Creator made a man and a woman? ⁵That's why a man leaves his father and mother and gets married. He becomes

like one person with his wife. ⁶ Then they are no longer two people, but one. And no one should separate a couple that God has joined together.”

God did not create men and women to be alone but to become one person together in marriage. This is the promise God gave to men and women, God made you to be joined together to become one person as husband and wife, remind him of this promise, **‘he said it’** remember. Also **Matthew -7-7-** promises answers from God.

This scripture Matthew-7-7-promises answers from the lord, ask and you shall be given; ask for a good man or a good woman, a godly man or woman, be very specific when asking anything from the lord, this applies to young men as well as to young women. Never just ask for a husband or wife, explain to the lord what kind of husband you would like and make sure you ask for a God fearing man, who loves the lord.

When you ask the lord for a husband don’t ask aloud, ask in the privacy of your own mind during your prayer time, the devil also hears your prayer if spoken aloud, and can try and bring the wrong man or woman across your path. God is the only one who can read your mind and know your thoughts, the enemy cannot read your thoughts, he can place thoughts into your mind but he is unable to know your thoughts so ask in your thoughts in your prayer time for the specific husband or wife you desire, when you are at prayer. **Psalm 139-1-3**

You know my every thought.

Then you sow your husband seed or wife seed by saying. “God is giving me a Godly man, / or wife, someone who loves the lord and will love me like they love the lord.” You continually sow this seed every opportunity you get, and you water it **by saying aloud**, “thank you lord for a Godly man who will love me like he loves you.” The enemy can’t get at this prayer; he knows this is the kind of husband or wife that God himself would pick for you. A man or woman who loves the lord will love their partner just like they love Jesus. You tell the lord the size, colour, looks, and things you would like in a partner, be specific when asking for a partner.

Four

Asking god for big things

You know most Christians don’t ask for **big things** from God they have a **small mentality** because they hear preachers say, that **‘God won’t give them something for nothing,’** or that **‘Jesus was poor,’** and both of these statements **are lies**; lies told to the preachers and lies then told to us through those preachers, these lies are coming from the enemy whom Jesus described as a thief a liar and a killer and a destroyer; his greatest delight is telling Christians that Jesus was poor so you should be poor also, be humble like Jesus. That is a lie to keep you from asking God for the prosperity he promised you.

Jesus was never poor

First of all, Jesus was born in a stable, **“BECAUSE THERE WAS NO ROOM AT THE INNS.”** **Secondly** he lived in a **‘HOUSE’** not the stable; he was born in the stable, {true} but did not live there. When the three wise men came to see him they came bring him gifts of **gold frankincense and myrrh**. Gold fit for a king, they didn’t bring him just a few gold coins, they were coming to visit a king, they brought a lot of gold, a lot of frankincense and lots of myrrh. They were coming to visit the king of the world and didn’t come with tiny gifts, which his

father and mother received. These three men were spoken of as **kings and astrologers**, people with lots of money. They did not come alone as stories seem to say, they travelled in a caravan of many men, soldiers and warriors, those were difficult times and dangerous times, and they didn't travel alone through many countries to get to where the star stopped. These men were wealthy men and did not come to the stable as most Christians believe, the star stopped over the house where Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived. Joseph had a good trade he was a carpenter, {a joiner in today's terms,} a great trade to have those days, there were no motor mechanic or IT experts those days. So Jesus was provided for from birth, and then probably learned the trade from his father Joseph until he entered into ministry.

11 When the men went into the “house” and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they knelt down and worshiped him. They took out their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh and gave them to him.

Thirdly Jesus was supported in his ministry by a group of women; he had a treasurer {Judas,} and Jesus knew he was a thief, as well as a traitor, but he controlled the purse strings, which meant that he had money for the group. God provided for Jesus and the Apostles because they all gave up everything to follow Jesus. God provided for Jesus all his life, and he will do the same for you and me if we believe.

Matthew-27:55-New-International-Version

many women were there, watching from a distance. They had followed Jesus from Galilee to care for his needs.⁵⁶ among which was Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joses, and the mother of Zebedee's children.

Jesus had a bunch of groupies as they would be called today, he had his supporters in these women, and these women cared for his needs, probably washed his clothes as well, they catered to him and the Apostles.

This book is about seed for sowing, seed from the seed giver but how can you believe in God giving you seed if you think he doesn't supply financially or any other way, if you think you are supposed to be humble by being poor; how can you help the poor if you are without money.

2-Corinthians-9:10-Amplified-Bible

And [God] Who provides seed for the sower and bread for eating will also provide and multiply your [resources for] sowing and increase the fruits of your righteousness [which manifests itself in active goodness, kindness, and charity].

His word says **he** will provide and multiply your resources for sowing and increase the **‘fruit of your righteousness.’** He will supply, not you. Christians we have got things all wrong, we think we have to do this or that out of our own means but that is a lie, it is God who supplies our ‘seed,’ so he can increase our resources and increase our fruit, it is **he alone who supplies**. If you think well, I have money of my own that I earned, you are so wrong, he gave you that good education and later that good job so that you could earn good money and have all you desire. He provided you with seed for the sowing. When you give away money, to help the poor remember it is God's money you give away, he gave it to you in the first place, nothing

is by your own efforts, and even your own efforts are by his grace and mercy. When you die, try taking all your wealth with you **if it's yours!** Come on face reality, if all the money and wealth and wonderful things like fancy cars, yachts, houses in foreign lands are truly yours then take it with you when you die!

If you can't then who owns it? God says in his word all the gold and silver and the cattle on a thousand hills are his, he created the earth with its diamonds, platinum, gold and jewels, and other wealthy items, so everything belongs to him and him alone, we have things on a temporary loan, no matter how wealthy we are at this time we live on this earth. But God actually says, 'store up wealth in heaven,' good deeds, kind acts, giving help to those in need and that wealth passes through into heaven with you, amazing when you think of it isn't it, gives us a reality check.

God provides wealth so that it can be shared with others, seed for the sowing, and the amazing thing about that seed, it returns back tenfold. You can give away and have more than you gave away, but with everything God gave you, you still need to ask for seed for the sowing, and what seed to sow, and where and when does he want you to sow?

Jesus warned; don't cast your pearls before swine. In other words just don't give something away to those who are not in God's plan of receiving.

Matthew-7:6-King-James-Version

Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend { slash you apart} you.

You just don't help everyone for not all appreciate it or even want it, that is why we need to ask God whom does he want me to sow seed to and what seed do I need to sow, and could I have that seed lord.

God's word tells us to give to the children of God first; we don't have to give to third world countries or to others before we give to the **children of God**, they are our first priorities. **This does not mean we should not help the poor**, but we have to help the children of God first. For example I see on GOD TV Joyce Mayer has a ministry in Africa and some other countries helping the poor, she is a Christian women who needs financial help to run these programmes. And I see on TV other worldly organisations needing help to help people in need in Africa. Which does God say we should sow our seed to first? We sow to the children of Gods helpers because they are concerned about the people spiritual needs as well as their feeding needs. The worldly organisations seek only to help them with food, their spiritual needs are not an equation, and this is the difference between the two.

If you can help the two, great, so be it; but **first** seek Gods seed and where it needs to go to. Do things God's way not the world's way.

Do not think I am saying don't help the worldly poor, but first help the Christian poor.

Five

Obedience is what is blessed.

Obedience to God is what gets us blessed; doing what God says is doing what God wants'.

2-Corinthians-9:10-Amplified-Bible

And [God] Who provides seed for the sower and bread for eating will also provide and multiply your [resources for] sowing and increase the fruits of your righteousness [which manifests itself in active goodness, kindness, and charity].

It is God who will provide seed for the sower, your God also supplies your bread for the eating, and he will increase the fruits of your righteousness, what a God we have!

Sowing seed in our everyday life is simply telling others about Christ Jesus but even then we should ask lord which seed do I need from you first, most of us Christians don't do this we have never thought about seed sowing except in the terms of money. We need to learn to always ask first before we do or say something. Non Christians would be more receptive to us if we asked God for the right seed to sow, in other words what shall I talk about with this unbeliever? Even non believers know about Jesus but are not interested in him because they see little of a way of a spiritual difference in the Christian than them; Jesus is just some good man to them, so we need to ask the seed giver what seed do I need from you and when do I sow it; then we will see great conversions. Amen
